

MIXED MEDIA BIBLE ART JOURNALING BASIC TOOL KIT

What kinds of products can you use in your journaling bible? Honestly.... pretty much everything! You will use all or most of these supplies every time you work in your Bible.

- Each student must supply their own tools for use in class
- > We have a very limited few of each tool to share if you do not have them
- Consumable products on the basic list must be provided by each student
- Bible (preferably a journaling Bible with 1 ½" to 2" margins on the outer edges)
- Clear Gesso (Dina Wakley by Ranger, other brands are too coarse)
- Matte Medium, fluid (by Liquitex)
- Acrylic Glazing Medium
- Pencil, White Eraser, Ruler, Scissors, Paper towel, unscented baby wipes
- Brushes: several with small pointed tips, or one water brush with pointed tip
- Stylus, with a very small round end
- Water misting bottle (ie: Ranger Mini-Mister for best control of water on page)
- Black permanent marker (ie: Dylusions Paint Pen, Bella Blvd Illustrated Faith)
- Ink Blending Tools & Sponges (ie: Mini Ink Blending Tool by Ranger. You need three handles & three sponges dedicated to page prep—plus an extra tool & sponges for inks & paints)
- Heat Tool (Ranger Heat-it Tool is recommended--higher temp heat tools may damage Bible pages)
- Tracing Paper (ie: Strathmore transparent parchment tracing paper)
- Transfer / Graphite Paper (both dark & light)
- Elastic, ¼" braided (two pieces, each long enough to tie around your Bible top to bottom)
- Clean scrap paper, to protect pages not being worked on (recommended: cut a non-stick craft sheet into two quarter-sheet pieces to slip behind pages, and the remaining piece to use as a palette)
- Palette (an old lid works), but a non-stick craft sheet is highly recommended
- Water bucket (old plastic container works great!)
- A tote bag, bucket, or bin to carry everything in!

Any additional tools, paints, or inks that may be useful in each particular class will be emailed in advance of the class date
